CHIEF, OF REGISTRATION COMPLIANCE & ANALYSIS (RCA) AND
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Mr. Cook serves as Chief of Registration Compliance and Analysis (RCA) and Chief of Transaction Analysis and Mitigation (TAM). From July 2014 to November 2018, Mr. Cook simultaneously served as Chief of the Compliance, Registration and Enforcement Division (CRE) in the Office of Defense Trade Controls Compliance (DTCC). Mr. Cook as the Chief of RCA and TAM is responsible for review, analysis, and issuance of registrations and assessment of material changes in the form of amendments or renewals, and mergers, acquisitions, and divestitures. Mr. Cook became the Chief of RCA in November 2011. Mr. Cook returned to the Department of State Directorate of Defense Trade Controls as a Senior Compliance Specialist in the Compliance and Registration Division in May of 2006. Mr. Cook has over 30 years of international trade experience. Mr. Cook was a Governmental Programs Executive at International Business Machines Corporation (IBM) from 1996 to 2006. Mr. Cook was instrumental in the development and maintenance of an export management system for IBM and its subsidiaries worldwide including processes, procedures, training, and internal compliance reviews. From 1990 to 1996, Mr. Cook served as a licensing officer in the Office of Defense Trade Controls Electronics and Combat Systems Branch. Mr. Cook reviewed and acted on export and temporary export license applications, requests for advisory opinions and agreements. He chaired two interagency working groups for approximately a year tasked by a Presidential Directive to modify and update the U.S. Munitions List that resulted in rewrites of the ITAR, Categories XI and XIII. He began his government career in 1986 as a licensing officer in the United States Department of Commerce Bureau of Export Administration Computer Systems, Microcomputers and Telecommunications Branch. Mr. Cook received a bachelor's degree with honors in business administration and a minor in computer science from Liberty University.
